#### STUDENT MEDICATION AT SCHOOL:

There may be circumstances that require students to have essential medication administered to them by the school. Essential medication is defined as a "physician-prescribed medication that must be scheduled during regular school hours and is necessary for the student's health or well-being." The request for giving essential medication must be supported by a statement from the physician prescribing the medication. The re-



quest must include the dosage and frequency of the essential medication and other relevant details such as duration of prescription and storage instructions. If your child requires medication administered to them at school, please contact the school office. A form will be sent home to be filled out by a parent and physician. We are not able to administer medication until we have received this form. Please do not send medication to school for your child to consume on their own. All medications must be kept at the office. Thank you.

#### **LUNCH EXPECTATIONS:**

Caronport Elementary School continues to offer lunch supervision for our students who require it. Our lunch program is intended to support families who have the following circumstances:

- · Students who do not live within walking distance from the school such as bus students.
- · Students who are too young to be home at lunch on their own.



We do encourage students to leave for lunch, if possible, as lunch time is a great opportunity to recharge and get ready for the afternoon of learning and fun. If your child(ren) need to stay for lunch beyond the above circumstances, please let you child's homeroom teacher know.

We appreciate your support by reminding your child(ren) that staying at school for lunch is a privi-



lege that carries with it the responsibility to adhere to our school's lunch expectations. *All students who stay for lunch are expected to remain at school throughout the lunch period.* If your child has your permission to leave the school premises, please advise your child's teacher in advance.

You can create your own new password, but it also must be done on a computer (not a phone or tablet) If you need to use a school computer to do this, please contact us—we can accommodate you! After you have created an account, you can log on anytime (on a computer, phone or tablet) to see mark submissions, attendance, etc for your son/daughter. All report cards will be published on this parent portal as well.




• Costumes cannot include replica weapons of any kind. We appreciate your cooperation and look forward to this special day!

#### Help Your Child Succeed in School: Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early

#### DID YOU KNOW?

- · Starting in preschool and kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- . Missing 10%, or about 2 days each month over the course of a school year, can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just one or two days every few weeks.
- · Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences and tardiness can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Eventually good attendance will be a skill that will help them succeed in high school and college.

#### WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- · Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Keep your child healthy and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Introduce your children to their teachers and classmates before school starts.
- Develop backup plans for getting to school if something comes up.
   Call on a family member, a neighbor or another parent.
- Try to schedule non-urgent related medical appointments and extended trips when school isn't in session.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors and other parents for advice on how to make your child feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- If you are concerned that your child may have Covid-19, call your school for advice.
- If your child must stay home due to illness, ask the teacher for resources and ideas to continue learning at home.
