Attendance

By June 2024 - our school-wide attendance rate will be 90%.

Reading

Primary: By June 30, 2024, 85% of grades 1-5 students will read at grade level measured by Fountas and Pinnell and (grades 1-4) and Basic Reading Inventory (grade 5).

Secondary: 90% of students in grades 1-5 will move up 2 reading levels as measured by Fountas and Pinnell (grades 1-4) and Basic Reading Inventory (grade 5).
