

# **GRADE 9 & 10**

Math 10 Foundations – linear systems and how to use a graphing calculator. Linear systems are made up of two linear equations. We have been learning how to find the solutions for both equations by graphing, substitution, and elimination strategies.

**Art 10** – my music through the decades PowerPoint.

**Com Cook 30** – cooking with different varieties of rice and pasta.

Career 9 – the group videos we made which will highlight and emphasize the benefits and education required for careers which we have found interesting and unique.

**PE 9/10** – my nutrition assignment and how we have followed the Canadian Food Guide to improve our diet.

**Com Cook 30 –** cooking with different varieties of rice and pasta.

**Biology 30** – cells, the parts of a cell and the cells' function. We learned the difference between active and passive transport. We did experiments dealing with osmosis and diffusion. We are beginning to learn about photosynthesis and cellular respiration.

**PAA Construction 20/30 –** the construction of the deck chair and the redesign of our shop benches.

**PE 20/30** – ultimate frisbee and how we are coming up with strategies to complete passes and earn points.



- Students must arrive at the school 15 minutes prior to exam start.
- Exams begin at 9:00am and 1:00pm SHARP!
- Students must enter the exam room prepared with pens, pencils, etc.
- Electronic calculators are required for all Math exams.
- Students must remain in the exam room for at least one hour.
- Students who have completed their **assignments**, **projects**, **etc.** in all classes and have a signed (by parent) *Permission to Leave* form may leave the school after completing an exam.

# 10 Ways to Prepare for Exams

- 1. Keep up with your work be sure all assignments, projects, etc. are completed and handed in prior to exam time.
- 2. Many students find that preparing for an induvial class for 60-90 minutes per day, 5 or 6 days per week, will leave them well-prepared at exam time.
- 3. Don't cram at the last second.
- 4. Complete a mock test and try to answer the questions without using your notes. If you do this 3-4 days before an exam, you'll then know where to focus your studying.
- 5. Do not multi-task while studying. For most people that means turning off visual/auditory distractions, including cell phones, social media, and music with lyrics.
- 6. However, many online sites can be beneficial. Visit educational sites to enhance your studying.
- 7. If you have any outstanding questions, go see your teacher at least 3 days before the exam. If you've given yourself a mock text in advance, you'll be able to show the teacher where you're struggling.
- 8. Put together a study group or study with a friend. You can review and compare notes, ask each other questions, explain ideas to one another, etc.
- 9. Make sure to get plenty of sleep. Sleeping hours are often the time when we completely synthesize information, especially topics we've covered in the couple of hours before bedtime.
- 10. Develop a good "morning-of" routine. Eat a healthy breakfast and get a bit of physical exercise. If music gets you going, go ahead and play something upbeat.
