Health - the effects of smoking and alcohol.

Arts Ed - my First Nations mask.

PE 5/6 – how to kick a soccer ball with force while keeping it low to the ground.

GRADE 7 & 8

ELA 7 – the monster I created and the oral story I told to the class to explain the origin of the creature. Also, ask me about the first few chapters of *Truth and Lies* and what I have learned about foreshadowing and "showing not telling" in an author's piece.

ELA 8 – the novel *Holes* and how the analogous storylines are finally connected at the end. Also, ask me about the visual assignments I have completed including a drawing of God's Thumb and the yellow-spotted lizard and how I used textual references to create.

Math 7 & 8 – how to graph linear equations and derive an equation from a set of data points.

Science 7 – our unit on mixtures and solutions. We learned about the difference between WHMIS and HHPS symbols. We have been learning about what matter is and the three states of matter. We have learnt about the first 20 elements. We had a lab on how to measure mass and volume using the graduated cylinders and triple beam balances. We are currently working on making a variety of solutions.

Social – the different types of maps of the world and how the proportions of countries change.

Health 9 – the dangers and potential risks associated with social media and using online tools and sites. Also, ask me how to protect myself and others while online and how I highlighted this information in an infographic.

PE 7 & 8 – how to kick a soccer ball with force while keeping it low to the ground.

GRADE 9 & 10

ELA 9 – Act III of *Romeo and Juliet* and how I am summarizing the information I have learned into a descriptive paragraph about either Romeo or Juliet. Also, ask me about formal language and how to create a proper invitation for an event.

ELA A10 – the first part of the novel *The Hunger Games* and how I used visual works to represent concepts and ideas (a training center and Katniss). Also, ask me how the setting of Panem represents a dystopian world.

Math 9 – our new unit on polynomials. We have been classifying them as: monomial, binomial, trinomial and polynomial. We have started looking at the degree of each term and combining like terms.

Math 10 W&A – currency and finding a unit price. We calculated discounts as well as increases in salary. We have been learning about complementary and supplementary angles in our new unit on angles.

Science 10 – making chemical compounds, using word equations to write chemical equations, and balancing these chemical equations. In our next subsection, we will be learning about acids and bases, as well as the pH scale. We will be determining if a variety of substances are acidic or basic. We will be preparing for our big unit exam.

History 10 – what social changes were brought about during the Industrial Revolution.

Health 9 – the dangers and potential risks associated with social media and using online tools and sites. Also, ask me how to protect myself and others while online and how I highlighted this information in an infographic.

Com Cook 30 – making cookies. We have made drop cookies, rolled cookies, and pressed cookies.

PE 9/10 – how to gain control of the soccer ball while it is bouncing.

GRADE 11 & 12

Communication 20 – our study of persuasive language, including a letter I wrote to a local governing body and a piece I wrote to convince my reader about a well-known conspiracy theory. Also, ask me about my "protest speech" and how I'm utilizing persuasive language to affect social change.

ELA A30 – the group project (visual and oral presentation) we prepared on a physiographic region of Canada. Also, ask me about the novel *Indian Horse* and how I am using the text as a mentor text,

or piece of inspiration, for my own quick writes and personal narrative.

Math Found 20 – the difference between mean, median and mode.

Math Found 30 – solving probability considering the independent and dependent events.

Health Science 20 – the components of blood. We made a visual representation of the red blood cells (red candies), white blood cells (marshmallows), platelets (white rice) and plasma (canola oil).

Com Cook 30 – making cookies. We have made drop cookies, rolled cookies, and pressed cookies.

PE 20/30 – how to gain control of the soccer ball while it is bouncing.

December 16 – Formal Day


December 17 – Santa Hat Day


