### GRADE 7 & 8

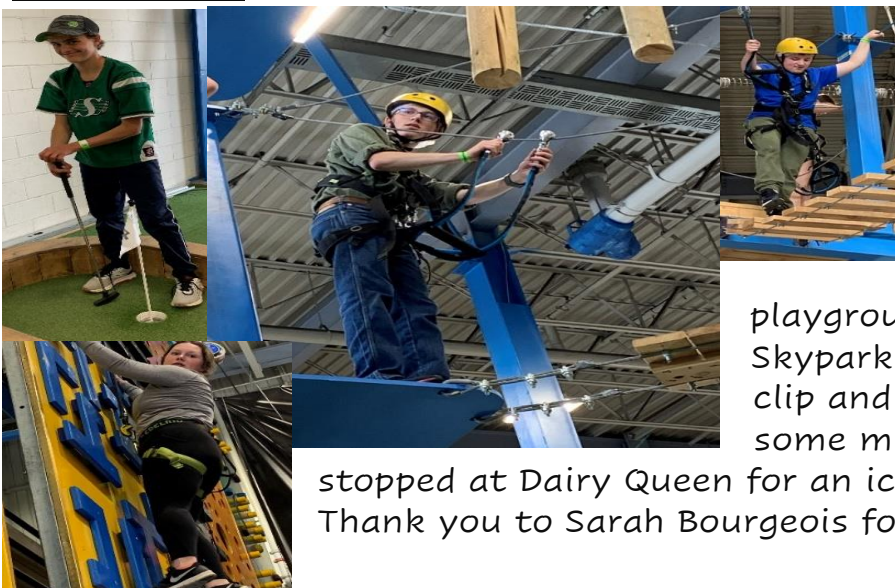
