News

- 1. Young Worker Readiness Certificate Course (YWRCC) is a mandatory requirement for all 14 and 15-year-old workers in Saskatchewan. Many teachers are incorporating it into their PAA, career education and CWEX classes. This is an interactive online course with instructions, tests, learning modules and certificates of completion.
- 2. Along with the YWRCC, you will want to look into the <u>Career Safety Education</u> (CSE). This is a fantastic opportunity if you are currently on your way to building your resume and wanting to look like a star candidate for your future employers. Now you can receive safety training for FREE. Safety training looks great on resumes and post-secondary applications, as well as <u>scholarship applications</u>. 3. Apprenticeship Opportunities:

- The <u>Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship</u> (SYA) program helps students explore opportunities in the skilled trades. Students complete required assignments and earn 100 hours of trade time credit per each level completed (3 levels = 300 hours!). Other benefits include the waiver of registration fee (currently \$175), the waiver of first level of technical training tuition (approx. \$600) and the opportunity to win a \$1000 scholarship (over 100 were awarded last year).
- The <u>Apprenticeship Credit</u> is an opportunity for students to earn a wage and up to 4 credits (Apprenticeship A20, B20, A30 and B30). Students need to secure employment with an approved journeyperson and work 100 hours to earn the credit. The 100 hours of trade experience count towards the required apprenticeship hours.
- 4. <u>Trade Up Saskatchewan</u> is a website for people who are interested in the construction trades. It includes apprenticeship, related jobs, and over 35 different sector trades.
- 5. <u>See Your Future</u>, a large virtual career fair will take place Nov. 3, from 9:45 3:00 pm. Contact 306.260.1314.
- 6. Interested in a post-secondary career fair? <u>SUTIL</u> (Saskatchewan Universities and Technical Institutes Liaison) will be offering virtual career fairs this fall to allow you to check out Saskatchewan and some Alberta post-secondary institutions. Each school division has been given a specific date. Prairie South's date is **November 5**, although you can attend any of the scheduled dates. You can view the videos before attending the session. You need to have Zoom downloaded, but you don't need a Zoom account, in order to participate. Presentations are 30 minutes long with a 15-minute question and answer session at the end. - 7. The Duke of Edinburgh Award Program offers a non-competitive program of extra-curricular activities that encourages personal growth, perseverance, responsibility, and service within our communities. This program of goal setting, confidence & responsibility looks great on a resume or scholarship application, and it is fun to do. In addition, students can receive a Special Project Credit for each of the 3 levels they complete.
- 8. Are you teaching CWEX or Career Education this year? The Ready for Work Program is a project that the Saskatchewan Federation of Labour runs in co-operation with the Workers' Compensation Board and Saskatchewan Labour. It is designed to reach as many new workers as possible, including high school students and workplaces across the province. - 9. <u>myBlueprint</u> has a ton of resources, webinars, and videos to assist teachers in using the program more effectively with students. It's free, and the division website has <u>links</u> to the site as well as information for students and parents to login.

UNIVERSITY OF REGINA:

- Students pondering their options as future university students will want to attend the <u>2020 Fall Open House</u> on **October 3, 9:00 am to 5:00 pm**. It is an excellent opportunity for students and parents to tour the campus and attend informational sessions.

MEDICINE HAT COLLEGE:

- MHC <u>applications</u> for Winter 2021 open on October 1. Applications for fall 2021 open on November 1. Use <u>Apply Alberta</u>.
- Most of their programs are First Qualified, First Admitted, which means you should apply as soon as
 possible. The competitive entrance programs include Nursing, Practical Nursing, and Paramedic.
 They also offer many pre-professional programs such as pre-dental hygiene, pre-dentistry, pre-medical
 laboratory science, pre-medicine, pre-nutrition, pre-pharmacy and pre-veterinary medicine.
- There is a new program called <u>Agroecology Technician</u>, which will accept applications starting November 1, 2020.

LAKELAND COLLEGE:

SASKATCHEWAN POLYTECHNIC:

- Sask Polytechnic Open House dates will be on October 19 to October 22 from 4:00-9:00 pm.
- <u>Career Counsellors' Update</u> will take place October 6 from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm and October 7 from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm.
- Grade 12 students wanting to attend one of Saskatchewan Polytechnic's **First Qualified-First Admitted**<u>Programs</u> (most of their programs), should <u>apply</u> as soon as possible. As long as high school students are enrolled in the grade level that will qualify them for admission, they can apply.
- <u>Women in Trades and Technology Exploratory Sessions:</u> Regina, Oct 3-Nov. 20. \$300 This hands-on career exploration course for women 15 years of age and up offers an introduction to a variety of basic trade skills. Each workshop is led by a female trades professional and course content includes basic skills in: Auto Body, Automotive Servicing, Building Systems (Regina only), Carpentry (2-day Saskatoon only), Electrical, Machining, Plumbing, and Welding.

UNIVERSITY OF SASKATCHEWAN:

- There is an <u>early admission</u> **deadline of December 1** for the competitive ranking-based colleges of Education, Kinesiology and Bachelor of Science in Animal Bioscience. Eligible applicants with an admission average of 90%+ will be offered conditional admission and will not need to wait for the competitive ranking to take place in February. The final application deadline for these colleges is still **February 15.** Remaining applicants will be ranked competitively, and spaces will be offered from the top down according to admission average.
- The <u>Best and Brightest Scholarships</u> require students to apply for admission by **December 1**. The application for Best and Brightest Entrance Scholarships is due **December 15** and consist of the following scholarships:
 - George and Marsha Ivany President's First and Best Scholarships
 - o Chancellors' Scholarships
 - U of S Entrance Scholarships
 - o Edwards Undergraduate Scholarships
 - o College of Agriculture and Bioresources Renewable Entrance Scholarships
- The application deadline for the <u>Competitive Entrance Awards</u>, Scholarships, and Bursaries is **February 15th**. All students applying to the University of Saskatchewan are encouraged to apply.

- The College of Engineering is changing the <u>first year</u> for its students. It includes a structured schedule, revitalized curriculum, and a stronger foundation.
- The U of S is moving into a new building in its Prince Albert campus. Check out the <u>programs</u> available in PA.
- There are opportunities to <u>meet with U of S recruiters</u>, among other events.
- Applications for 2021-2022 to the U of S and St. Peter's College is now open.

St. Peter's College:

- St. Pete's awarded over \$90,000 in scholarships, in addition to the thousands of dollars their students received from U of S as well.
- They have a new <u>programs page</u> that shows all the programs offered, tuition breakdown, registration deadlines, what the program is about, and more.
- They are offering a new <u>Diploma in Writing and New Media</u> for 2021-2022. This is SPC-exclusive and is only offered with them, and students interested in a 4-year degree can take this simultaneously.
- SPC is offering a 20 30 minute <u>virtual information session</u> on **October 4 and 5 at 6:30 PM.** Students, parents, teachers, and all others are welcome to join.
- We help students identify which degree they are interested in studying.

Scholarship Spotlight

The <u>Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship</u> has changed to a needs- based award. Students must apply for Canada-Saskatchewan student loans. It is \$500 per year up to a lifetime maximum of \$2,000.

<u>Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship Industry \$1000 scholarships</u> are rewarded each year to about 100 students who complete the Youth Apprenticeship passport. Each school nominates a potential candidate and winners are announced in June. Many Prairie South students have won this scholarship. Check with your school administrator, PAA teacher or guidance counsellor for information on how you can earn 300 hours towards an apprenticeship trade along with the chance to win a \$1000 scholarship.

<u>Our Way – Employment and Social Development Canada</u> can help with financial assistance of scholarships and grants; saving, planning, and paying for your education is within reach. Included are links to Colleges and Universities, post-secondary program search, repayments assistance estimator, career tool, and information on studying abroad.
