

Social Science Courses

There are three major streams of social sciences that can be taken:

1. **Native Studies 10, 20, 30**

- The aim of the Native Studies program is to develop personal awareness and cultural understanding and to promote the development of positive attitudes in all students towards Indigenous peoples.
- This course focuses on identity, kinship, community, governance, and perspectives related to Indian, Metis, and Inuit peoples within Canada.

2. **Social Studies 10, 20, 30**

- These courses focus on the study of people and their relationships with their social and physical environments. The knowledge, skills and values developed in social studies help students to know and appreciate the past, to understand the present, and to influence the future.

3. **History 10, 20, 30**

- These courses investigate and discuss the major events that have occurred throughout history both Internationally and within Canada.

Other social sciences that are offered, include:

Psychology 20

- Topics: Who am I? How do we make sense of our world? Dream analysis, memory, learning, group psychology, dysfunctional social behaviors.

Psychology 30

- Topics: Development across the lifespan, from baby to death.

Law 30

- Topics: Our legal system, case studies, the way people operate in the world under the laws we have.
