We have been offering tips to help parents with their child's reading. We hope you find these ideas useful. Here are some ideas that promote reading at home.

- Don't leave home without it. Books in your vehicle are a great way to promote reading while travelling.
- 2) Ask your child questions about what they have read to dig deeper into the story.
- 3) Take control of the television and video games.
- 4) Pick books that are at your child's level.

- 5) Play word games.
- 6) "I read to you; you read to me." Take turns reading with your child.
- 7) Read with your child every day!
- 8) Read with your child even after they have learned to read. This is a common mistake parents make.
- 9) Point out letters and words around you. This can be while at the mall, out for a walk or around the house.

Even before they can understand words, reading to children teaches them to associate books with love and affection. Reading books can be a special time between parent and child.


#### Scholastics Book Fair
